Franklin Wright, this \$2,500 scholarship will be awarded this spring to one student. The purpose of the scholarship is to financially assist promising students who are transferring from Cerritos College to a four-year college or university and plan on becoming mathematics teachers at the secondary, college, or university level. The scholarship may be used for any of the following: books, tuition, fees, and room and board while attending college.

To be eligible for the scholarship, you must be a Cerritos College student who will transfer Fall 2010 to a college or university. Other scholarship criteria include:

- Overall 3.0 GPA or better
- Successful completion of at least 2 semesters of calculus with 3.0 GPA or better
- Financial need will be considered
- Must be planning to pursue a career as a mathematics teacher
